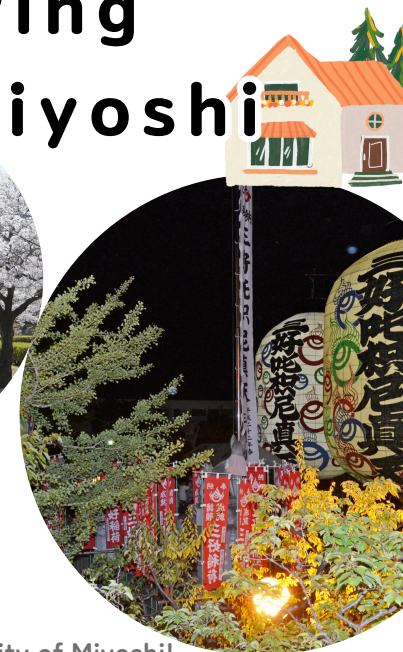

1 Emergency phone numbers

1-1 In case of fire or emergency

If you need help in case of a fire or emergency (sudden illness or injury) and need to call a fire truck/engine or ambulance, call ☎119

- ① Is it fire or emergency (sudden illness or injury)
- ② Explain addresses or locations easily, clearly and slowly
- ③ State the name and phone number of the person who called ☎119

Ambulances cannot be used for minor illnesses or injuries.



1-2 When a traffic accident or crime occurs

In case of a traffic accident or crime, call ☎110

- ① Is it a traffic accident or incident
- ② When and where
- ③ What happened?
- ④ Are there any injuries?
- ⑤ State the name and phone number of the person who called ☎110



If someone is injured and you need to call an ambulance, call ☎119

2 Daily Life



2-1 Garbage disposal etiquette

- ① Please put out your garbage at the designated place by 8:30 am on the designated day.

Ask your neighbors or the city hall where to put out your garbage.



- ② When putting out the garbage, squeeze out all moisture from kitchen garbage, separate it according to the garbage sorting instructions in the QR code below, purchase a garbage bag specifically for the city, and put the garbage in it and put it out.

- ③ In order to prevent damage by crows, cats, etc., if there is a net, be sure to put it back up after taking out your garbage.



The days on which you can put out garbage are determined by the type of garbage and the area where you live.

2-2 Traffic Rules

In Japan, pedestrians should walk to the right and cars, motorbikes, and bicycles should walk to the left.

Pedestrians have the right of way at crosswalks.

When riding a bicycle, be sure to pay attention to the following!

- ① You must not ride a bicycle while listening to loud music.
- ② You must not ride a bicycle while using your cell phone.
- ③ Do not run side by side.

Please keep in mind to ride the bicycle safely 😊
